

Etiquette

NO DISTURBANCE OR DISTRACTION

Players should always show consideration for other players on the course and should not disturb their play by moving, talking or making any unnecessary noise.

Players should ensure that any electronic device taken onto the course does not distract other players.

On the teeing ground, a player should not tee her ball until it is her turn to play.

Players should not stand close to or directly behind the ball, or directly behind the hole, when a player is about to play.

ON THE PUTTING GREEN

Players should not stand on another player's line of putt nor when she is making a stroke, cast a shadow over her line of putt.

Players should remain on or close to the putting green until all other players in the group have holed out.

SAFETY

Players should ensure that no one is standing close by or in a position to be hit by the club, the ball or any stone, pebbles, twigs or the like when they make a stroke or practice swing. Players should not play until the players in front are out of range. Players should always alert greens' staff nearby or ahead when they are about to make a stroke that might endanger them. If a player plays a ball in a direction where there is a danger of hitting someone, she should immediately shout a warning. The traditional word of warning in such a situation is "fore".
